Payment Due Date & Autodrop for Fall 2025	The payment deadline for students enrolling on or before July 25th for Fall 2025 is Friday, August 8th. 	The Admissions office will prevent autodrop for students who have active pending residency appeals, reclassification, or nonresident tuition exemption requests on file as well as students who have recently applied for Financial Aid and eligibility is pending.
Student Parent Priority Registration	Student parents who provide at least half of the support for their minor child will receive Priority 0 (P0) registration. To qualify for Spring 2026 P0, eligible students must certify their eligibility in eServices between August 23rd and November 23rd. Priority .5 Request Form	Beginning in August, counselors will be able to use an eForm in eServices to request Priority .5 on behalf of students who will be registering for their last semester and meet either degree or transfer requirements. This streamlined form asks counselors to confirm which requirement the student meets and is sent immediately to A&R for processing after submission. A&R will process all eligible forms received before the end of Priority .5. Students will be notified of the outcome via email.
Graduation Requirements Clarifications	During, and leading up to, summer, A&R received some great questions about graduation requirements. Below is a summary of these questions and answers:
	Q: What's the new residency requirement for degree requirements?
	A: Beginning Fall 2023, the 12 unit residency requirement was updated statewide to apply at the district level rather than the campus level. This means that students need 12 units earned within the district to apply for an ADT or local AA/AS at any Los Rios college.
	Q: Is there a residency requirement for ADTs?
	A: Yes, colleges may require, and Los Rios colleges do require, ADTs to meet the same residency requirement as local degrees.

	Q: Do students with baccalaureate degrees need to complete general education requirements for a local AA/AS?
	A: Students with baccalaureate degrees earned from regionally accredited institutions in the United States, or foreign degrees deemed equivalent to the above by a NACES or AICE member evaluation service, will have general education requirements for local degrees waived upon receipt of official transcript or official evaluation.
	Q: Do certificates have a residency requirement?
	A: Certificates of Achievement do not have a residency requirement at this time.
