## Item 2: Proposed change to DAS Constitution

Article V: Section 6

The President shall serve a term of office of two years, beginning <u>on June first</u>. at the conclusion of the final regular meeting of the District Academic Senate in May. The second year of the President's term is subject to confirmation by a majority vote of the members of the District Academic Senate. A confirmation vote will occur in April of the first year of a President's term. If not confirmed, the officers of the college academic senate in the current rotation will select a replacement.
