o Create proposals for the future of ethnic studies programs, degrees, and courses in the district

o Consultative body for ethnic studies discipline input on equivalency decisions for hiring

Oliver reported that there was a meeting last Thursday with articulation officers, curriculum committee chairs, senate leadership, ethnic studies faculty and other interested faculty which was a follow-up to a meeting which had been hosted by Woodland College on December 4.

Background: AB 1460 (Weber, 2020) establishes a new CSU graduation requirement of ethnic studies---as part of lower-division general education (GE). The designator for the three-unit course must be in Ethnic Studies (plus a few other designators that we don't have in Los Rios). There were also two resolutions adopted at the recent ASCCC Fall Plenary Session.

There was robust and thought-provoking discussion about the proposal with all in attendance in support of the Council.

In response to a procedural question on what would be considered as a "related discipline," Oliver suggested the disciplines that have been assigned to current courses. She also noted that District Human Resources will be sending her a list of faculty members who possess the MQs for the discipline of Ethnic Studies (see Supporting Material for the discipline MQs).
