# DAS Leadership meeting with King & Nye Tuesday April 21, 2020

#### **Online Education**

- King & Nye would like...
  - The Executive Sponsorship team to set measurable goals for Online Coordination Council
  - Contemplate what lessons have been learned during this time of remote operationslogistical and student service needs, need for PD on best practices in online education and Canvas usage, need to address the digital equity divide
  - Consider the questions, "what would success look like in two years if we are doing this well?"

### Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act

- <u>CARES</u> funding comes in two pieces-a pieces for direct student assistance and a piece for organizational assistance
- Available for direct student assistance is 13.5M
  - o First half of that money to be distributed to students using FAFSA eligibility to distribute
    - amount of awards will be tiered according to unit load, based on Financial Aid census
    - direct cash to students by end of April
  - Second half of the money, metrics will be developed for a fall distribution process to try to expand the net to reach other students outside of FAFSA eligibility
  - Dreamer students are not eligible for CARES money, but the district will use other money to assist those students
  - In communication with Sara Goldrick-Rab to discuss LRCCD using <u>Edquity</u> technology tool for students to quickly seek aid

# **Budget Reduction Planning Process**

- LRCCD is planning sooner rather than waiting, since all state budget realities may be delayed from typical timelines because of tax deadline extensions
- Future budget may be quite stark given the realities of the state, nation, and globe
- Summer is a fairly full FTE schedule, although all online
- Fall will be a 90% FTE schedule, so a 10% FTE reduction in fall is necessary; reductions will likely continue for spring 2021
- With such stark budget realities positions for temporary classified, adjunct faculty, and non-federal aid student workers will end up being reduced.

### **COVID-19 Situation for Fall 2020**

- All faculty need to be prepared for the possibility for 100% online instruction in the fall
- With the unknown situation of 'stay at home' and 'physical distancing' requirements for the fall, there is a very real chance of being online in the fall

- Online and Canvas training opportunities will continue to be provided this spring and through the summer
- LRCCD will not be partially open if there are physical distancing requirements. In that situation the decision will be to move to 100% online instruction and remote operations, with possible exceptions for 'cannot converted' courses to be worked out on a case by case basis.

**MOU with LRCFT**-for 100% online teaching load for tenured faculty for 2020-Spring 2021 by mutual agreement; additionally, faculty may ask for ADA accommodation for online teaching with a doctor's note

**Quick Start Training**-launches May 1st to help faculty with Canvas basics; not required to attend if you already are proficient in Canvas; Increasing resources in summer for DE coordinator compensation to meet increases training needs

**Email**-District Office Executive Team has decided to eliminate the of use of 'everyone on exchange' emails beyond one's home college. Some exceptions will be made, for example to allow college leaders the ability and allow for professional development opportunities to be shared across the district.

#### **DAS Liaison Appointment-Scott Crosier**

 This ad hoc task group will have a continue item in the report area of the agenda in order to report to DAS. Scott may do those reports or anyone from this group may join us at DAS to report.

#### **Professional Development**

- Professional Development at each college should have an Academic Senate appointed faculty leader and that faculty member should be reporting back to local Academic Senates
- When working with local PD you then would have a connection to the Academic Senates through this appointment and reporting structure
- Also, would be encouraged to reach out to local Academic Senates to request a place on the agenda to present information like what was done at DAS
- Important to solidify a pre-assignment (before a faculty member is offered the course) PD plan for faculty to make sure they are prepared for teaching in a incarceration facility and understand the limitations (technology, academic freedom, etc.)

 Would need to work closely with administration to make sure they knew of this PD plan, and likely a LRCFT conversation

#### Curriculum

- Each college has a local curriculum committee and there is the District Curriculum Coordinating Committee (DCCC)
- Courses needing curriculum go through the local process, then once approved locally move to DCCC, from DCCC all curriculum goes to the Board of Trustees for approval
- Looking into the process for a correspondence course addendum for those courses taught for incarcerated students will need to happen considering COVID-19
  - o On the DCCC agenda for Fri April 24<sup>th</sup>
- With current COVOD-19 crisis
  - o assignments have due dates
  - instructor-initiated contact with students happens through written letters delivered back-and-forth
  - student-student interaction to discuss and work on content may happen in the facility without on-site presence of instructor
- Current instruction may in fact be more of a hybrid between the federal definition of distance education and the federal definition of correspondence education
- Where does the quality of the education come into play?

### **Equity Plans/Matriculation**

- District Matriculation & Student Success Committee (DMSSC), soon to be District Equity & Student Success Committee would be a place that makes sense for a work group involving this group
  - Mari should connect with co-chair Melanie Dixon AVC about this possibility
  - Also faculty could reach out to faculty co-chair Karen Tercho
- Each college also has a committee (various names) that work on matriculation and equity issues
- Interest in recognizing re-entry students as a DI population
- Perhaps recognize re-entry students in each college's equity plan, which would be important for funding purposes
  - o CRC may already be considering this; need to check in with T. Emiru and A. Casareno
  - o District would need to create student level identifier to track re-entry students

#### Other items...

- Re-Emerging Scholars to become a pathway at SCC with first year seminar for it (similar to Puente and Umoja pathways); FYS anchor class each semester for these students and then the pathway courses
- HDC 112 dedicated to re-emerging scholars for CRC this summer
- Important to consider the many SUJIC issues which exist
- How to involve ARC in the dialog?
- At DO, Sue in the grant department is supportive and may be a good resource

Would be good to increase Mari's visibility and interaction at the colleges with the
administrators to gain more support, for instance with the need for some pre-assignment PD for
faculty considering working with incarcerated students
