8. Updates from the District (Jamey Nye):

- Jamey was asked how to get old 12-17.5 unit certificates CCCCO approved. Do we need regional consortium approval? Yes. We need minutes that reflect they have been approved by the consortium because CCCCO requires it. We can bring them through in batches. Since they are already offered, we won't have to get LMI data. Move forward by asking the consortium to reflect in their minutes that they approve offering the certificates. This is not to bypass good practices in CTE to evaluate programs using LMI data to see if they are meeting labor market needs. Bill: Do we need a new board date? Jamey: They may want an updated board date. Mary suggested contacting Jackie Escajeda to see if there is a process we can follow. Jamey will follow up. Jamey: Any new 12-17.5 unit CTE certificates should come through NFN (announcement for under 12, approval for over 12) to make sure there is not any unnecessary duplication in the region. (This is still being discussed at NFN.)
- English automatic prerequisite checking 3 designators are ready for the Fall. (ENGLT at an impasse, ENGRD will be dealt with later.) ENGLT is working on a compromise, such as running a two-year pilot (still being decided) with ENGWR 300 as the prerequisite for courses applicable to the ADT and ENGWR 101 for the rest. Will do research to see how this affects things after the pilot is over.

9. DAS Report (Troy Myers)

• Equivalency/min quals discussion is going on. Board language isn't consistent with Title 5 – that a dean can sign off on equivalency in an emergency. This will be changed. There is a move to replace D2L with Canvas. CAI is going on – colleges are on board. Multiple measures data looks great.

10. SAG Report (Bill)

 a. Question about recommended electives in programs – Phil would like to get rid of the recommended electives section of a program outline, but wants DCCC input first. SCC okay with it going away. CRC would like to keep it. FLC will ask

- their committee. ARC doesn't use that section, so it can go away. Bill will take this information back to SAG.
- b. Question about non-ADT transfer degree language in COR ARC has created three transfer-oriented Engineering degrees, and the PCAH says we must use CSU-GE Breadth/IGETC patterns, not local AA/AS GE pattern. Should we use the ADT GE language in Socrates (which has a GPA statement in it) or have Phil create a special one for transfer-oriented degrees that are not ADTs? Mary: The new PCAH looks like they are changing that policy. You may want to wait until it has been approved.

11. Music Courses Families

- a. MUIVI families (2nd reading) move: Dyan, second: John, unanimous vote Bill: When will the new families be effective? Decision: June 1, 2017 Bill will send out an updated families list, now that it has changed.
- b. MUP families (2nd reading) Proposal is to <u>not</u> create families for MUP courses at this time. move: Dyan, second: Richard, vote: Lisa Lawrenson abstained and all others present voted to approve.
