- B. Status of Collaboration Requests:

- i. We will wait until 310 is done. Encourage developer to get 310 done and through.
- b. Several 198, 298, and 498 courses: Discussion on how colleges are proceeding
 - i. They are lowering the minimum unit to .5
 - ii. At SCC: treating them as Consent Item.
 - iii. ARC: moved them to one person's name coming through full committee
 - iv. FLC: moving smoothly changing ownership the most onerous part
 - v. CRC: coordination between colleges. "Problem" being different launch dates, some have the .1/ others the .5. Need to move them all through as much together as possible.

VII. Action Item:

- A. Proposal to revise Board Policy 7241 to allow C- grades from other institutions to meet Los Rios major requirements. (Attachment 3)
 - i. Evaluators at the 4 colleges were treating grades inconsistently across the 4 colleges. Accepting a C- and treating it like a C is a huge problem because a 1.7 being accepted as a 2.0 can be huge when overall GPA is calculated.
 - ii. Students would be given more opportunity if we accept the grade rather than reject the course all together. And it would be streamlined across the four colleges.
 - iii. It will go to the DAS then Chancellor's cabinet, then Board of Directors
 - iv. Alisa approved, Renee seconded and voted to move it along. Passed.

VIII. Updates from the District

- A. PPC Vetting Process. Review the process in Spring 2021 (Attachment 4)
 - i. Torence: last time revisited in 2017 Albert spearheaded it. Needs spritzing. Clarifying the need for support documentation. CTE programs have an entirely separate process. How rigorous at this stage to include labor market information on the front end?

XI. Discussion Items

- A. Los Rios Ethnic Studies Council Update on work and timelines.
 - i. Keith Heningburb: SCC and CRC have chosen the courses and submitted them to CSU and waiting to see what is demanded. One FLC course has also been submitted. Creating templates for processes. Helping to create local taskforces to shoulder the load before they go to district council.
 - B. Consider a special DCCC meeting on 4 February for New to College ETHNS courses.
 - i. Renee moved to approve/Monica seconded. Four abstentions (Lynn, Shannon, Juana and Albert).
 - C. Similar / Cross-listed courses in the District and Degree Planner Update
 - i. Alisa suggested an ad hoc task force due to all the work done on the front end. After they do some work, they can suggest whether it should be a standing committee. Lynn asked "what does 'similar' mean in this instance?"
 - ii. Membership who is going to be on it? AOs and Curriculum chairs? Let's cast a wide net and see who is interested. Alisa mentioned that we need a write-up about what is involved and then academic senate presidents can choose some people.
 - iii. Renee commented that there are already standards that exist concerning financial aid, etc. Those people should also be involved.
 - D. Proposal to remove local Credit by Exam unit/residency requirement Update
 - i. Will do this next meeting
 - E. Anti-racism and equity in curriculum: Ongoing discussion on how each campus is addressing or plans to address the topic. Inviting authentic student engagement.
 - i. Local campus updates: FLC: senate body is working on representation on governance committees, by-laws, to get shared voices on all levels.
 - ii. SCC: CRC shared that they have a good resource and using that to move forward.
 - iii. CRC: gave a flex presentation on the document that Rose spoke about (it's archived on their website).
 - iv. ARC: using a more professional development approach actionable equity workshops.
 - v. Renee: equity program high impact outlines: Math, English and communications are all in review and are being targeted to create rubrics, etc.
 - F. GE alignment project: Update on progress, and identify next steps
 - i. Lynn: all four colleges agreed and submitted for re-review courses that we know will be denied because then they'll (C1) enter a two year faze out. Don't know what which courses are next. Some developers are hesitant about losing GE approval.
 - G. Catalog year start date: an issue because currently the new year starts with summer session but new articulations do not take effect until fall.

i. Renee/Valarie seconded. Passed.
