A. Guidance for Virtual Meeting

Adoption of Findings Related to Public Meetings Pursuant to AB 361:

BACKGROUND:

On September 16, 2021, Governor Newsom signed AB 361, which amended the Brown Act to provide local legislative bodies the ability to conduct virtual meetings under certain circumstances. The legislation included an urgency clause, which made it effective immediately.

AB 361 allows local legislative bodies to conduct virtual meetings during a state of emergency proclaimed by the Governor under certain conditions, including when "the state of emergency continues to directly impact the ability of members to meet safely in person."

If the state of emergency is ongoing, the local legislative body must adopt certain findings by majority vote every thirty days in order to continue using the virtual meeting rules under AB 361.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the District Academic Senate (DAS) (DCCC) adopt the finding "the state of emergency continues to directly impact the ability of members to meet safely in person."

A. Academic Renewal (Powell)

Shannon, points out that maybe this would be a good policy for transferable courses also. Torence will follow-up about the transferable course issue.

We need to change the DE section to comply with changes to Title 5. There will not be any new guidance from CCCCO. We have draft language to add

to outlines in the DE section.

C. Equity Efforts (Jaques)

Curriculum committees are working on DEI in outlines. There is some pushback from faculty developers. What can we do about this?

- share tech rev comments with the whole department
- this is voluntary so far but title 5 (section 55002?) will be changing to address this problem and require IDEAA in outlines
- this is also a problem with courses shared in the district
- have the local senate pass a resolution supporting the Curriculum Committee's efforts
- look at course level success data to help support changes
- workshops for willing departments/faculty are working well
