- D. New GE pathway, subset of Cal-GETC
 - a. DCCC proposal:
 - i. the district adopts the new associate degree GE pattern and adds to it a
 3-unit Living Skills requirement identical to the current area IIIa and IIIb

- requirements, which would require updating Board policy and regulations
- ii. the district allow students working toward an AA or AS degree to choose between using that new GE pattern or using the Cal-GETC transfer GE pattern, or any other transfer GE pattern (e.g., CSU GE Breadth and IGETC), which would require updating Board policy and regulations
- iii. each college clearly indicates, in its listing of courses that are approved for the new local GE pattern, which courses are also approved for Cal-GETC

 - ii. Webinar before today's DCCC meeting: summary of discussions and progress thus far. Questions about taxonomy. No final recommendations made yet. Question raised if we should sign our course numbers with C-ID outlines: to be considered.

- G. Final recommendation is still pending. Standards 1.0 is out, next version is pending. Not a set system yet for how CalGETC will be approved. Based on IGETC standards, but additional nuances that may not be in CalGETC (courses may or may not be grandfathered in).
- H. AOs made a list of courses that are approved for CSU but not CalGETC; anticipate using a system in Winter 2024 to request approval for these courses.
- I. Crosswalk in Socrates: not to be mistaken for approval in CalGETC.
- J. July 1, 2024 all incoming students must be placed on an AD-T pathway if one exists for their major.
- K. Tammy will distribute a list of the TMC for all available majors, double check if local campus needs to adopt an AA-T
