### VII. Action Item(s)

A. Coordinating GE course approvals for new GE patterns (1<sup>st</sup> reading)
An attempt to find common ground when there is not a consensus between colleges for courses on GE patterns. All courses with the same designator and number should meet the same requirements. It is currently not all the same across the district. DCCC is advocating for a 'convergence' structure to exist when there are concerns / disagreements regarding a GE approval or CPL. The 4 AOs would be part of this, along with the DCCC chair, unless the chair is part of the department disagreements. It would then be the DAS President. The hope is to find common ground. If no common ground is found, there would then be a recording of a vote and taken back to the DCCC for a final decision.

No objections to moving this forward. It will thus move to 2nd reading for our April meeting.

- IX. Updates from the District T. Montgomery discussed CPL. The State Chancellor's office recently released a survey for all colleges to complete regarding where we stand for CPL.

Since Socrates is the catalog, we should not be 'hiding' courses in the catalog; rather, ENGLISH, ESL and MATH departments should consider deleting courses that we are not offering, these 100 level, skill building courses. If needed we can get them back through Common Course Numbering. SAG asked DCCC to put together a resolution to the local

curriculum committees to get feedback.

The motivation for this is two-fold:

Keeping these 100 level, skill based courses in the catalog is confusing to students who would like to sign up for them, yet they never see them on the schedule.

It is a long scroll for students looking, for instance, at math classes to get through all the 100 level courses to the 300 level courses. If we do this, we should send a message out to the community to defend why we are doing this: citing law. If we do these deletions, it is too late for this catalog; therefore, we would need to wait until the 2025-26 catalog, so we have some time.

#### XII. Discussion Items

A. Coordinating changes to work experience CORs

89 are done. 4 at consent, 1 at tech review, 5 at department review. 18 are not open yet. The hope is that these courses are cataloged with the title 5 changes 8-1-24. This should be done to ALL Work Based Learning courses.

- B. Curriculum prioritization during the implementation of AB 928 (Bradford) ARC has just approved this document at its local curriculum meeting. It deals with all of the work associated with title 5 revisions, AB 928 and AB 1111. It sounds like the other colleges are interested in adapting it.
- C. Local Curriculum Committees question concerning administrator voting rights, any guidance or precedent (Bradford)
  Questions: Are there classified personnel with voting rights on committee? Are students voting members on committee?
  ARC has discussed voting rights via Administrators at curriculum meetings. Since curriculum is a 10+1 matter, the question is why should admin. have voting rights? Various members offered perspectives on this question. There was no decisive resolve on the topic.
- D. New AA/AS graduation requirements The discussion was regarding if the Board will accept the recommendation of DAS. 90% of faculty per the district wide survey say they would allow local degree students to use the transfer level pattern. In addition, to keep the local GE pattern at 21 units (title 5) was the top ranked choice among faculty. The runner up is the 21 units plus the Living Skills requirement. Come fall we will be prepared for the changes being made. R. Medina asked about what the Board feels about the recommendation
- E. GE area labels for new local AA/AS pattern (Gilley)S. Gilley says based on surveys from counseling, the L is the most preferred to identify Local degrees as distinct from Cal-GETC standards.
- F. Update on AP/IB/CLEP standardization across the district (Gilley) We are almost aligned across the dist. It is a work in progress.
- G. AB 1111 (Common Course Numbering)
  This Friday, there is a Common Course Council Meeting 3/29. The 6 courses that will begin this process have been released: English Comp, Critical Thinking, Intro to Stats, American History, Intro to Psych, Oral Comm.
