## Chair's Report (Approximately 40 minutes)

- Will the Council continue as it is now in the future fall? Next academic year?
  - Keith and Tami met with Julie Oliver about the future of the council. It's up to the council what we want to do about next year.
  - Robert would like to continue with the district wide committee in order to coordinate across the district.
  - Alex indicated that he appreciates the collaboration that has happened across the district. We need to clarify what the council is for and what our role is. Each department has autonomy. It may be nice to also to invite Melissa Morena from Woodland Community College.
  - Surangi indicated that the non Ethnic Studies faculty should play a supportive role and step back from curriculum and program development.
  - Malika said she appreciates the collaboration of the group and she would like to see it continue.
  - Mark would like to see the group continue.
  - Walter indicated that there may be issues related to other disciplines. To help make things smooth and amicable, the group my be able to help with that.
  - Victoire indicated that it might be better to invite regional guests for specific agenda items. Other meetings could be local only. We could have different parts of the meeting for local groups and other section for guests to attend. Maybe the entire group doesn't need to meet at every meeting.
  - Tami indicated that regional meetings every few months could be useful. We need to define what we want to be within the District as well. The District Academic Senate President will be changing hands. Julie Oliver will be replaced by the ARC Academic Senate President.
  - Keith said we could go back to our founding document to figure out our purpose under the District and discuss this again.
  - Having an official status within the District Academic Senate gives us more weight and access to leadership throughout the district.

- Curriculum Development Work group Fridays this semester
  - Title change for 320, 330 and 340 and short title changes for 320, 330, 340 and 350 are in progress, please ask your curriculum committee for these to be consent items
  - o SCC, CRC, FLC have submitted
  - ARC will submit soon. Mark will need to submit before the end of February. Tami
     will work with Mark to make the edits.
- Program Development Work group Fridays this semester
  - Google drive collaborative doc
  - Keith mentioned that we could postpone this project until the end of the semester or even into the fall. We can set a goal to have it done by end of fall semester.
- Ethnic Studies Teaching Certificate discussion are we interested in developing?
  - We should get as much information as we can this semester to work on it in the fall.
  - High Schools will be required to offer Ethnic Studies within the next 5 years.
  - Many schools in the region are already moving toward teaching Ethnic Studies in the middle and high school. However, there is no consistency.
  - We would have to develop relationships with the districts to create some standards, training, budgets and authority.
  - We could also develop an institute, which could result in a bump in pay.
  - Currently some districts pay professional development companies to conduct the training. There are other instances when faculty with no training also teach the courses.
  - We should also pay attention to textbooks and what is being adopted at the school districts.
  - It is possible to work on the program and the teaching credential at the same time.

  - FLC (Tami Cheshire) enrollment is about 30-35 students per class. 1 section of 300 will be offered in the summer.
  - SCC (Keith Heningburg) Currently offering 5 classes (300s) this semester. Keith is currently teaching an HSI course. One section will be offered in the summer ETHN 300. Fall will have 3-300s, 2-340s, 1-320. All online modality.
