## Faculty Exchanges

Frank provided an update on faculty exchanges. He shared that President Ed Bush was
invited by Chancellor Sonya Christian to join a delegation of California Community
Colleges Chancellor's Office staff on a visit to Ghana from March 8-14, with the purpose
of strengthening international educational partnerships and developing a framework for
organizing support services to community colleges that provide international education
opportunities to students.

### **Updates:** College Study Abroad

- Richard reports that his FLC study abroad to Paris is full with students waiting for next year.
- Debi reported on the upcoming FLC study abroad to Japan.
- There was a discussion about the challenges and complexities of managing international student programs, particularly in the context of the pandemic. There was a discussion highlighted the need to be prepared for potential issues, such as visa problems and disruptions, and the importance of supporting students and faculty in case of behavior issues or disruptions. It was also mentioned that there is an increasing trend of trans students changing their genders and the potential implications this could have for students

traveling. It was suggested the potential value of bringing together students from different

programs to share experiences.

The challenges of securing scholarships for students, particularly in the context of the

Gilman Scholarship and the Umoja Statewide Scholarship. It was noted that the Gilman

Scholarship, which provides \$4,000, is difficult to obtain due to high competition. It was

also mentioned that the Umoja Scholarship offers financial aid to African American

students for study abroad programs.

It was suggested to expand the committee's focus to include international student

programs.

• It was suggested that the group reach out to the 4 colleges and their international

programs as a starting point to learn more.

**Updates: District Study Abroad** 

Frank shared that students are currently in Florence, Italy for the District Study Abroad Program.

Frank discussed the progress of the district study abroad program, highlighting the successful

selection of faculty for the next two trips to London and Florence.

International Education LRCCD Regulations Update - R-7151

Frank and Richard shared the progress of International Education LRCCD Regulations - R-7151,

which will be reviewed at the next District Academic Senate meeting.
