Obtain hepatitis B vaccine. Use latex gloves with IV procedures. Caring for patients with communicable diseases, Contracting diseases Consistent use of universal precautions. AIDS-related complex Lifting, moving, transfer of patients Attend classes conducted by physical therapy Musculoskeletal injury prevention of injuries.
